Dr. Andrew Baker is a British marine biologist whose research focuses the responses of reef-building corals to climate change. He graduated from Cambridge University, England, with a Double First in Natural Sciences before coming to the US in 1993 on a Fulbright Scholarship. A former Predoctoral Fellow of the Smithsonian Tropical Research Institute in Panama (1995) and a Doctoral Fellow of the Australian Museum (1997), he received his Ph.D. in Marine Biology from the University of Miami in 1999. He worked for the New York-based Wildlife Conservation Society (WCS), first at the New York Aquarium (1999-2000), and then in the Global Marine Program (2001-2005), where he was also a member of the adjunct faculty of Columbia University. In 2005 he joined the faculty of the University of Miami's Rosenstiel School, and became Associate Professor in 2010. In 2008 he was awarded a Pew Fellowship in Marine Conservation. He lives with his wife and three children in Coconut Grove, Miami.
