Previously, she worked as Florida Program Manager at Clean Water Action, where she spearheaded the Hold the Line campaign and generated grassroots support for Everglades restoration and water quality in South Florida. Dawn has been involved with a number of nonprofit environmental organizations has served on the Board of Directors of the Tropical Audubon Society in Miami, Florida since 2007. She also spent several years caring for and coordinating public education on Florida panthers and other captive born large predatory cats. Dawn's passion for national parks came from her early hiking and camping experiences in Fire Island National Seashore in her native New York.
