Jerald Ault, Ph.D., is a Professor of Marine Biology and Fisheries, University of Miami's Rosenstiel School of Marine and Atmospheric Science and lives on Key Biscayne, Florida. Dr. Ault is an internationally renowned fisheries scientist who has published more than 70 peerreviewed scientific papers, and another 150+ technical memoranda, book chapters, reviews and computer software on the biology, statistical assessment, modeling, and management of marine fisheries, particularly those in tropical coral-reef fishery ecosystems. He is a Fellow of the American Institute of Fisheries Research Biologists, founding member and on the Board of Directors of the Bonefish & Tarpon Trust, editor of the book *Biology and* Management of the World Tarpon and Bonefish Fisheries by CRC Taylor and Francis (2008), and coauthor of the book A Passion for Tarpon by Wild River Press (2010). His research has been featured on the CBS Evening News with Dan Rather, Good Morning America, NBC News with Brian Williams, National Geographic Channel, CNN, CNBC Squawk on the Street, Animal Planet, Outdoor Life Channel, Florida Sportsman TV, PBS Waterways, PBS Changing Seas, BBC UK, Voice of America TV, & numerous regional TV news broadcasts; and, in the Miami Herald, LA Times, Chicago Tribune, Reuters International and New York Times. He was named a Hero of Conservation by Field &

Stream Magazine (2006); and, recently he received the 2010 Bob Lewis Memorial Award for his body of work in

marine conservation and sport fishing.
