

An award-winning photojournalist, reporter and writer, Michael Kudas is the author of the bestselling book *High Crimes: The Fate of Everest in an Age of Greed*. The book was named Best Non-Fiction in USA Book News' National Best Books Awards of 2008, but its greatest honor was being a question on the game show *Jeopardy!* Kudas was part of a team of journalists at *The Hartford Courant* awarded the Pulitzer Prize for breaking news coverage in 1999. He has also received a Gold Medal from the Lowell Thomas/Society of American Travel Writers, and awards from the Pictures of the Year International competition, the Society of Professional Journalists, the National Press Photographers Association, the Society of Newspaper Design, the New England Associated Press News Executives Association, and numerous other professional organizations.

Kudas' work has appeared in the *New York Times*, *Los Angeles Times*, *Boston Globe*, *Denver Post*, *Newsweek*, [Outside.com](#), [OnEarth.org](#), GEO, Der Spiegel and *Suddeutsche Zeitung* – the largest newspaper in Germany, as well as numerous other publications in the United States and abroad. From 1987 to 2008 he was a staff photographer, writer, and picture editor at *The Hartford Courant*, America's oldest continuously published newspaper, where he specialized in adventure and environmental journalism. Kudas is currently working on a new book and multimedia project, *Megafire*, which will be published by Houghton Mifflin Harcourt in 2014.
